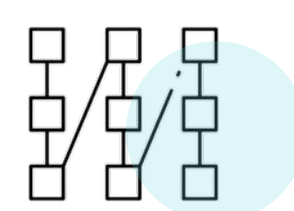
MODULE 1: PROJECT DEVELOPMENT

You will be provided with our Project Development Toolkit, an interactive pdf document that helps one think through typical project logistics like location, budget, scope, team, etc. We will conclude with a discussion on how to conduct a readiness assessment before launching a fundraising campaign.



MODULE 2: PREPARING A BUDGET

If developing a project budget seems intimidating to you, join the club! To make the process less stressful, we developed a custom excel budget form that makes developing a grant budget a breeze. We will go through how to use the spreadsheet and accurately calculate matching funds.



MODULE 3: FUNDING RESEARCH & STRATEGY

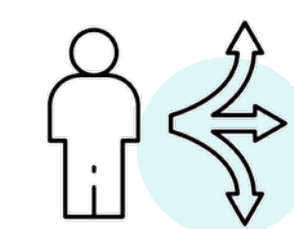
One of the hardest parts of grant writing is figuring out *which* grant to go after! In this session, you will get to research funding availability through a free trial of our favorite online grant database.

We will then discuss how you take information found during the funding research process to prioritize the select few worth pursuing. We provide practical tips on what questions to ask funding agency representatives, how to confirm eligibility, calculate average award size, and likelihood of success.



MODULE 4: GRANT WRITING PREPARATION

We will show you how to prepare a grant narrative template, host a grant writing kick-off meeting, and schedule deadlines for grant development. We always get feedback from past students that they especially loved this part of the class on tips and tricks for time management and staying stress-free.



MODULE 5: GRANT WRITING & DATA RESEARCH

Learn how to research census data using the American Community Survey database and other common methods for collecting health, energy, economic, and financial data. We will provide examples on how to embed data driven arguments into narrative responses. This session will have a specific focus on energy-related grant applications.



MODULE 6: ATTACHMENTS

We will discuss common attachments funding agencies tend to request and how to package a proposal for submission. We will close the day with what to do if your grant request was or wasn't successful and key lessons to take away from the workshop.
